We were invited by Friends of Histon and Impington community (Hi Friends) to take part and submit a decorated tree into the 2022 Christmas tree festival organised by Hi Friends in partnership with and to be displayed at Histon Methodist church.

We discussed ideas and Steve had a "WHEELY" good idea to use bicycle wheels to form the shape of the tree. This would remind the community of Camtrust's social enterprise bicycle refurbishment project.

Over the following weeks with our bicycle mechanics, we identified bike parts which could hang on our tree. These included different sized sprockets, a crank and various size bike wheels ranging from small child to large adult wheels. We cleaned each bike wheel, added a ribbon around the rim and attached bike reflectors onto the spokes.

Michael cleaned a broken bike chain and Clive and Len helped by cutting the chain into lengths. We glued the chain links into a star formation. When they were dry Claire and Katie sprayed them with silver paint.

A couple of weeks before the festival we assembled the tree in the Camtrust studio. Once we had put it together we started decorating it with the small decorations we had made. We added baubles with photos of staff, volunteers and clients inside or stuck on. We added tinsel and lights and cotton wool at the bottom to look like snow. We were pleased with how our tree looked - it was WHEELY good!

The day before the festival, Claire, Lilly, Len and Clive took the tree to the Methodist Church and set it up there. At the festival there were lots of trees made by local community organisations. Members of the public enjoyed looking at different trees and said our Camtrust Christmas Tree was one of the best.


